Maths Activities

Numbers and counting:

- Count forwards and backwards in ones from 0 to 30, 0 to 50.
- Challenge: Count forwards and backwards in ones from different numbers to 100 (and across 100).
 - Count forwards in 10s 10, 20, 30... How far can you go? Can you count beyond 100? Can you count backwards in 10? Start from 30, 50,100 and count backwards in tens.

Addition and subtraction: +, -, =

Do you know your doubles?

Write doubles of numbers 1 to 10 eg 1+1=2 2+2= 3+3= 4+4=

Challenge: Can you write the doubles facts for numbers 11 to 20?

Tens and Ones: Remember when we count lots of objects, we can make groups of 10's and in ones to add them up fast.



Here are 5 Tens and 7 ones = 57 Draw blocks of Tens and ones for these numbers in your book.

23 17 34 15 Remember the first number is for how many 10's blocks

Time - Do you know how to tell O'clock time?

Draw a clock face showing 10 o'clock.

Writing Activities

Handwriting:

Practise writing the days of the week in your best handwriting. Remember the days start with a capital letter.

Practise writing the 'Spelling words' in your best handwriting. (See spelling activity)

Remember **b**, **d**, **h**, **k**, **l** and **t** are **tall** letters. Remember **f**, **g**, **j**, **p**, **q** and **y** are letters that go **under the line**.

Sentences:

Practise writing sentences at home. Remember EVERY sentence must have a **capital letter** at the start and a **full stop** at the end.

Challenge: Can you use **and**, **because** in your sentences?

Ideas for writing sentence:

- I feel happy when
- I feel sad when
- What is your favourite sport and why?
 Think about the sport you love to play at school in PE lessons indoors and outdoors or think about the sport you play outside of school in a club.
- Learn to tie your shoe laces. Write instructions for your friend how to tie laces.
