

Maths Activities

Numbers and counting:

- Count forwards and backwards in 10s from any given number to 100.

e.g. 12, 22, 32, 42

- Practise your times tables and division facts for the 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s.

Eg. $3 \times 2 = 6$

$6 \div 2 = 3$

- Write all your number bonds to 10.

e.g. $6 + 4 = 10$

Challenge: If you can do your number bonds to 10, can you use these to help you know your number bonds to 20?

e.g. $16 + 4 = 20$

Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division:

Each day make up at least one addition, subtraction, multiplication and division equation. For addition and subtraction equations use numbers less than 100. For multiplication and division equations use your 2s, 3s, 5s and 10 times tables.

You could learn two a day and write a new sentence using the new word.

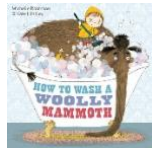
Reading Activities

Here are a few you can search for on YouTube:

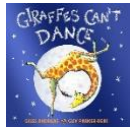
- How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth** by Michelle Robinson.

Writing Activities

Sentences:

Practise writing at home. Choose a different one each day. Use the ideas below or think of your own!

Ideas for writing sentences:

- Write about a super power you would like to have. What would you do and why?
- If you were the Head teacher of school what rules would you make. Write a list.
- If you had one wish, what would it be and why?
- Keep a diary for a week.
- Help a grown up with some baking. Write a set of instructions of how you made it. Remember to use bossy verbs at the beginning e.g. get, stir, pour, put.
- If you could travel to anywhere in the world, where would it be and why? What would you do there and what might you see?
- If you could interview someone famous, who would it be and what would you ask? Write a list of questions.

Remember EVERY sentence must have a **capital letter** at the start, a **full stop, question mark or exclamation mark** at the end. Try and use all the skills we have learnt this year such as conjunctions (e.g. because, when, if, but, that), adjectives (blue, shiny, delicious) and use your phonics to spell correctly. Don't forget to use your best handwriting too!

Topic Activities

Be a weather reporter!

Challenge: Use your sense of touch to find 5 soft things in your house and 5 hard things in your house. Write in your book the item and how it felt.

Create an alien. What would it look like? Be as imaginative as you can! You could draw it, colour it, paint it, make a collage of it, draw it with chalk in your garden or make a model of it. You could do a few aliens in different creative ways.
