 Count forwards and backwards in 2s and 5s from any given number to 100.


e.g. 50, 52, 54, 56. e.g. 75, 70, 65, 60, 55

• Practise your times tables and division facts for the 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s.

e.g. $5 \times 4 = 20$ 20 4 = 5

- Complete a word problem on the pages at the back each week.
- Go for a walk with someone at home (make sure you are safe) make a tally chart for something you see along the way. E.G. all of the different coloured cars you see, or the different animals you see.
