

Similes

Alliteration-

The **totally terrific teachers** worked so hard to make sure that their **perfect pupils** had interesting work to do for their home learning.

Metaphor-

The white blanket of snow covered the ground, which glistened like a million diamonds.

A Metaphor describes something by saying it IS that thing.

Whereas...

A Simile describes something by saying it is LIKE that thing

The snow covered the **glistening ground of diamonds**, like a white blanket.

Here, I have swapped them round.

Metaphors-

You could also say:

The snow was a white blanket that covered the ground.
